Then Peter Laughlin took us through the necessity and benefits of undertaking theological and Biblical training.

It was a quietly reflecting on the serious nature of ministry and what it takes to get involved. Discussions, questions and prayer were aplenty as we submitted our time and lives to God.

From the feedback we received, we're looking to do this again next year. There is a big need in the Vietnamese churches and I'm so thankful that something like this can be organised to equip and encourage the current and future ministers of God's Word.

# Alliance Youth Leaders' Prayer Meetings

Where has the year gone? It seems only yesterday that the Alliance Youth Australia (AYA) team meet for the first time for 2014 in April. At that meeting, we discussed where Alliance Youth had been, where we are now; and where we believed God was directing the ministry into the future. One thing that arose from that meeting was the conviction that we needed to do more to encourage communication and community between the C&MA youth ministries in their respective regions. The C&MA is not a collection of independent churches. rather a movement of believers who are passionate about establishing disciplemaking churches that will engage in worldwide evangelisation. The youth in our churches need to know this and know that they are not alone, but are a part of a wider movement - a larger family.



As a result of this conviction, AYA over the course of this year has inaugurated a series of Alliance Youth Leaders' Prayer Meetings. The purpose of the prayer meetings have ultimately been to provide the opportunity for networking and to create and maintain relationships among the youth and young adult leaders of the C&MA. I am happy to say that as of September, Alliance Youth Prayer Meetings have been held in Queensland, Victoria, Western Australia, two in New South Wales; and one upcoming in the A.C.T. I am also happy to report that each prayer meeting was well represented by youth and young adult leaders in their respective regions, with calls for further celebrations of prayer as leaders found them beneficial to their local ministries.



As Alliance Youth Australia continues to unfold plans for more Leaders' Meetings and other national events (such as the upcoming Young Adults Camp in October 2014; The Amazing Missional Race in February 2015; and IMPACT: The National Alliance Youth Camp in October 2015), I ask C&MA leaders and churches to continue to pray for and support the ministry of AYA.
