In June, I had the wonderful opportunity to go on an Envision short-term mission trip to Taipei, Taiwan. Partnering up with a local church, I was able to experience and participate in the church's excellent ministry, proclaiming the Good News of Jesus Christ to the people of Taipei.



Now, when I say 'shortterm mission trip,' Taipei may be one of the last places you would expect 'missionaries' to go. Why? **Because** Taipei is a fast-paced,

western-influenced modern city. In Ximen alone (where the church I visited is located) there is a McDonalds, KFC, multiple Starbucks restaurants, theatres, cinemas and shopping centres. In fact, in the heart of Ximen, there is an intersection that could easily be mistaken as Times Square in New York City! Almost everywhere I went I was bombarded by advertising slogans,

products for sale, people going about their daily business; and what seemed to be hundreds of thousands of scooters and taxis!

Yet, beneath all the 'hustle and bustle,' beneath all of the activity, the people, lights, large posters and mammoth LCD screens, there was activity on the spiritual level. Ancestor and temple worship is still a massive part of Taiwanese culture. Though more and more young people in Taipei do not go to temple by their own initiative, they still attend to honour their parents and culture. It is therefore no surprise that Christianity is seen as a threat to their way of life. Young people who are introduced to Christ are faced with the very real prospect of being rejected by their family, if they decide to stop worshiping their ancestors and worship Jesus alone.

The church I was involved with is called The Aroma and is located in the heart of Ximen. The church owns and runs a café which serves as an entry point into the community. It is in this multistorey community-hub where a weekly church service is held... Continued on Page 3
